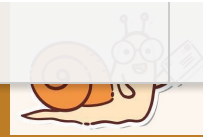

## Pumpkins & Frost at the Farm

We had the first frost of the season on October 30th- earlier than expected! The team spent the last week of October making sure we gleaned every last tomato, pepper, herb, and green. Some hearty greens, like collards and kale, can survive and even get sweeter after a frost, but since we need to shut down our water before any pipes freeze, even these were harvested. The Soup Kitchen and Cafe chefs got creative with every last piece of produce possible. Just a few tasks remain to shut down the farm for the season: final mulching on beds, pruning of perennial plants. and storage of tools and supplies from the





Neighborhood kids spent lots of time at the farm in October - painting pumpkins, pressing leaves and flowers, playing in the early snowstorm, and getting photos taken at our Halloween photo booth!

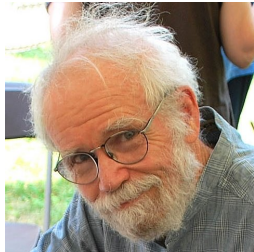
