Program Updates | 2024

Thanks to your incredible support, we've been able to grow our programs, expand our reach, and make a real difference in the lives of so many.

Here's a look at what we've accomplished together this past year:

Nourishing Our Neighbors: Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry

Hunger continues to be a pressing issue in our community, and with your help, we've been able to respond in a big way. Our Soup Kitchen served more than 35,000 hot, nutritious meals to those in need, offering not just food, but a welcoming and dignified space. At the same time, our Food Pantry distributed over 7,500 bags of groceries, ensuring families could put healthy meals on their tables.

Providing Stable, Affordable Housing

A safe, stable home is the foundation for a thriving life. Our affordable housing program — with 110 units in the South End — continues to provide just that. Our 24 SRO units for formerly homeless individuals provide more than just a place to live, but also offer residents the support they need to move forward.

Growing Fresh Food and Green Spaces: Urban Agriculture

We believe that fresh, healthy food should be accessible to everyone. That's why our Thornton Street Farm produced 3,600 lbs of fresh produce this year—food that went directly to seniors and community groups in our neighborhood. Meanwhile, through our Urban Gardening program, we led over 60 hands-on gardening experiences for students at Melvin H. King School, teaching the next generation about growing food and caring for the earth.

Empowering Youth Through Cooking: Take Back the Kitchen

Our Take Back the Kitchen program is all about equipping young people with essential cooking skills, confidence, and a love for good food. This past year, we facilitated 167 cooking classes with 1,328 participants, including 114 justice-involved youth. In our kitchen, young people learn more than just recipes—they gain independence, teamwork skills, and a deeper connection to their food and community.

Supporting Returning Citizens: Life Foundations Training (LiFT)

We know that coming home after incarceration can be incredibly challenging. That's why we expanded our Life Foundations Training (LiFT) program in 2024 to include both drop-in support and a new cohort model. In July, we celebrated 14 graduates from our redesigned program—each of them gaining the tools and confidence to move forward.

Expanding Our Support Network: Caseworker Services

This year, we also welcomed our first-ever caseworker, a huge step in making sure our program participants have access to the resources and services they need beyond what we provide directly. This means more one-on-one support, more stability, and more opportunities for those we serve.

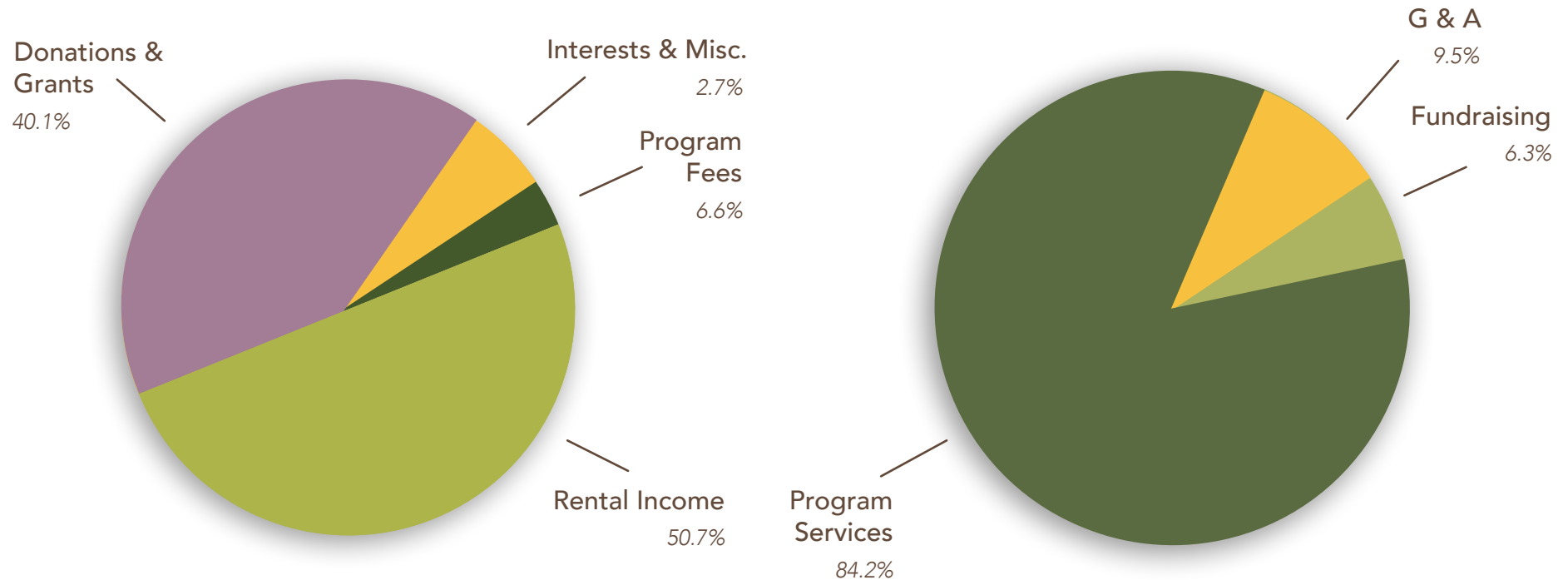
